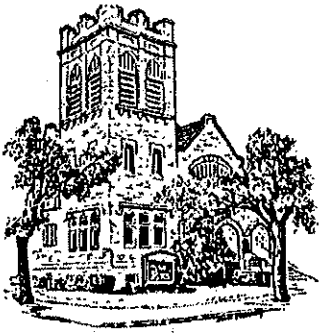

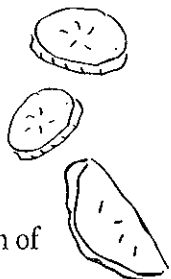
Make a Fruity Treat

You will need:

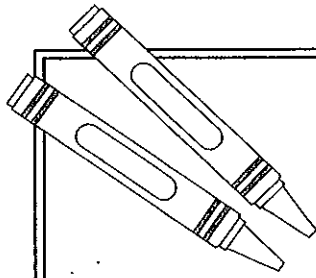
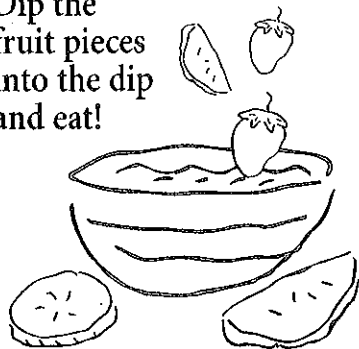
- small bowl

Dip the fruit pieces into the dip and eat!



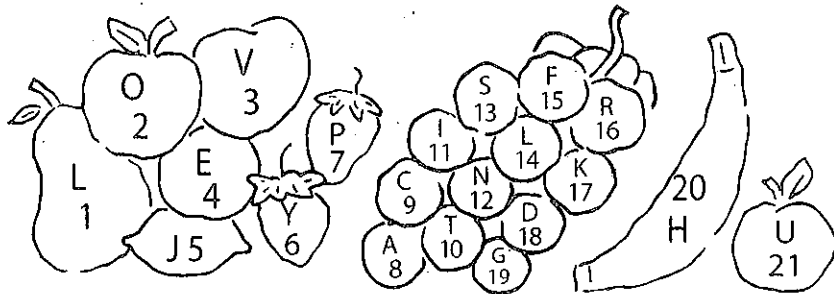

WESLEY WALKERS

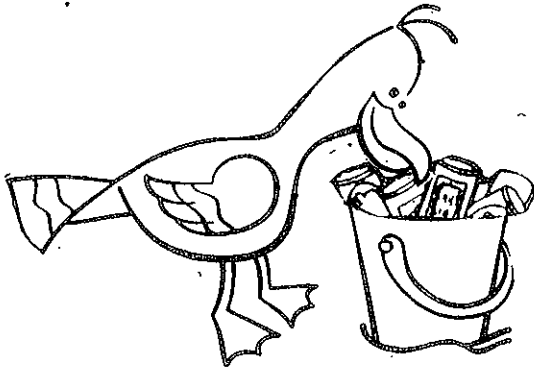

FOLK FESTIVAL

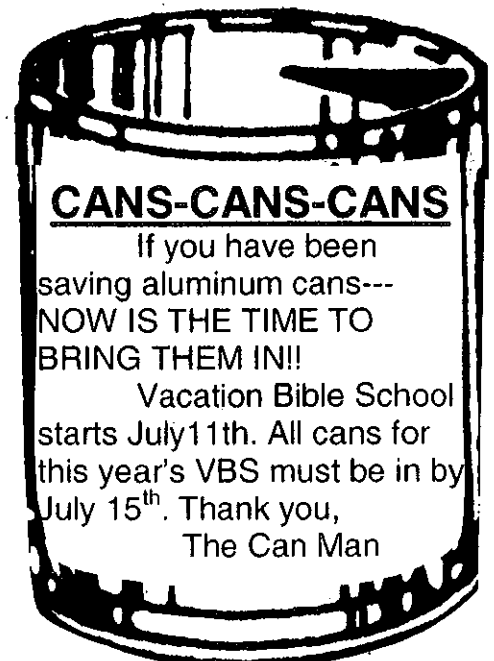
The Folk Festival will be held on Thursday, August 4th through Sunday, August 7th this year.

NICK SNOW MEMORIAL PIANO SELECTED

The plans for a sanctuary piano in memory of Nick Snow are now a reality. After opening the piano search committee to any volunteers, the resulting group of Joe Heckert and Mary Jo Lipski, trustees; Kathy Mago church organist; Barb Gaughan, choir director; and Emily Scaife King, music teacher accepted the task.

We researched company reputability and sought recommendations from many musicians. We compared value with touch and tone of the instrument. The unanimous decision of the committee is to purchase a Yamaha GC1M, 5'3" Baby Grand Piano in polished ebony from Modern Piano in Carnegie, PA. This beautiful instrument will last 75-80 years, filling our sanctuary with rich musical tones.

List priced at \$21,500, we will pay \$14,860 that will include: a matching bench, 10 yr. parts & labor guarantee, a heavy duty padded cover, delivery and set up, removal of our current piano, plus two free tunings. David W. Brown, the manager of Modern Piano, came and evaluated our current piano (\$1000 value) and assessed our sanctuary needs. The committee also visited the showroom and compared several models for price, touch, and tone. We, additionally, visited another store for further information.

The instrument we selected truly honors Nick Snow's 41 years of incomparable artistry and dedication to our church. With your continued contributions we could dedicate the new piano in September for Nick's birthday. Please mark your envelope "Nick Snow Memorial". Look at pictures of the Yamaha GC1M online and address any questions to the committee members. Your support will make this memorial for Nick a reality.

GOOD NEWS

We now have a contract with Cumberland Glass to restore the Good Samaritan window. The three bids are as follows, Associated Crafts.\$89,000, Willet Hauser , \$77,000. (company who did the Good Shepherd window, increase of \$33,000) and Cumberland Glass at \$61,775 dollars. Cumberland was our second choice on the Good Shepherd window but they were \$10,000 dollars higher than Willet Hauser. The window will be taken out in late fall and returned in the spring. We now have \$48,292.58, so that leaves us short by \$13,482.52. We have agreed to this contract because at the end of July it can be voided., Trustees and Council have approved this bid and again we say thank you for your support and as always **NOW THANK WE ALL OUR GOD.** Window Committee

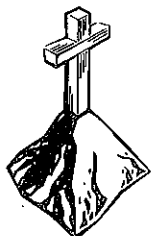

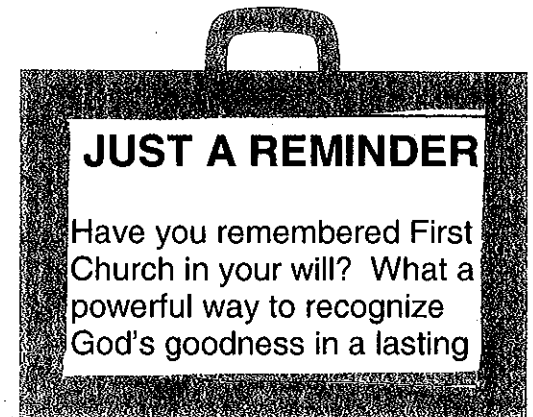

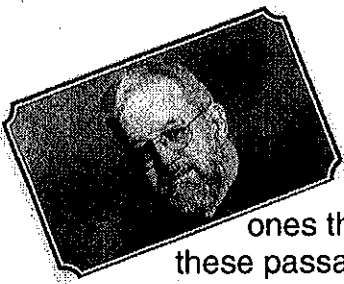

ALL THINGS IN COMMON?

We have been talking about a biblical view of economics. As we will see there are a number of Scripture passages that give us direction in this area but the ones that are immediately brought up in our day are Acts 2:43-45 and Acts 4:32-35. In these passages, immediately following Pentecost, the early believers are said to have sold their possessions, shared with one another and had all things in common so that there was no needy person among them. These passages are seen as a great support for a socialist type of economy. I constantly hear that socialism is a more biblical economic view and that it is better for the poor. That is partly why I am writing these little letters—to help me think through these ideas. This one really puzzles me for several reasons.

The first is that in socialism the government redistributes the wealth. The government takes from all who have and spreads out the resources to everyone. You give to others whether you want to or not—it is a government run economy. But the one thing that is completely and totally absent from these biblical passages is government. What we have here is the opposite of socialism—it is people giving to each other without coercion according to their own freedom. Have you ever noticed that there are only two ways any economic exchange can happen—either freely or forcibly. Freely is when both sides agree to make the trade for mutual benefit, and forcibly is when there is either theft or coercion. You may want to buy fire insurance for your business so you find someone who will sell you fire insurance at a rate that you are willing to pay and you freely enter into a trade where both sides benefit. That is not the same as a guy with a bent nose and brass knuckles walking into your business and telling you that you need to buy insurance from him so your store will not be burnt down. But, if the only two choices are free exchange and force then we must ask which of these two does government necessarily use? If you are not sure try not paying your taxes. There is no government involvement what so ever in these passages of Scripture because the early believers were freely caring for one another – this was communalism not communism, social concern not socialism.

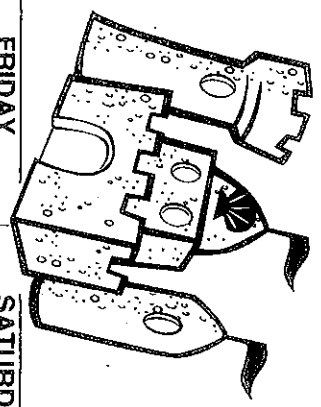
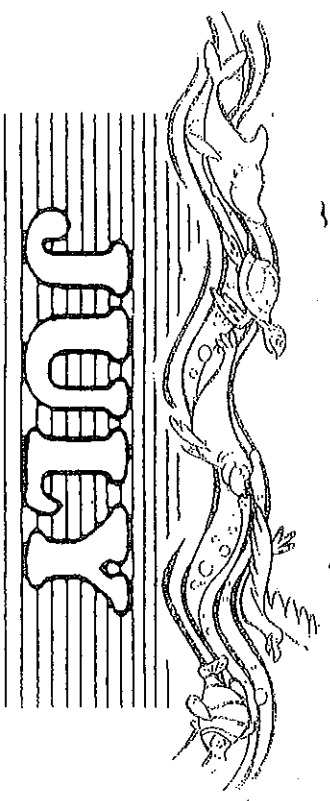
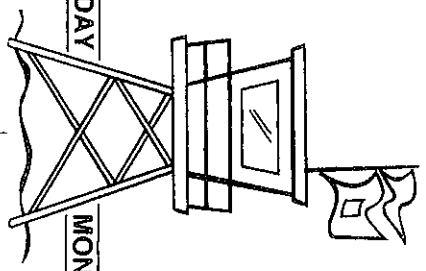
Second, we also need to notice in these passages that this kind of living did not last long. It is often said that these passages give us the norm we should strive for, but the early believers did not seem to keep it going very long and no attempt to recreate such a communal living arrangement has ever lasted. Though some have been very good and amazing examples of Christian love. There is no command to live this way and there is certainly no hint of calling on the government to run itself in this fashion.

Third, we are often told that a socialist form of government is best for the poor, but not even this freely formed kind of communalism seemed to ultimately alleviate poverty. No one was in need in the days immediately following Pentecost. True, but it was not long before Paul was taking up an offering from the rest of the church to help them. People freely helping each other is the biblical standard; government taking from some and giving to others is not found in the biblical record. It does not help the poor, it makes more poverty. It does not do away with greed it only shifts it to those making the decisions about redistribution.

There ought to be more of the community found in Acts 2 and 4. There ought to be more sharing with one another and support for one another in the body of Christ. But, as we will see in a future note, we ought not to be passing this responsibility off onto the government. We are told to freely care for one another, we are told to freely lift up the poor, we are told to freely love our neighbor, we are not told to pass the responsibility on to the government which, by nature, must do it by force. The sharing in Acts was following the move of the Holy Spirit. As believers our compassion for one another, and for the poor, is to be freely led by the Holy Spirit not the government.

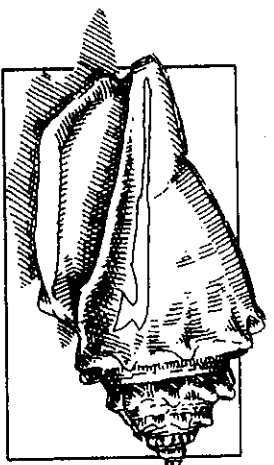
