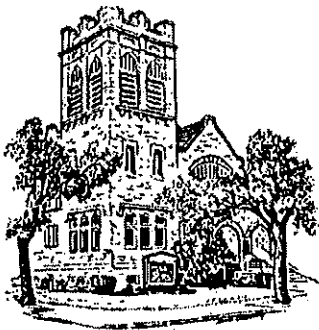

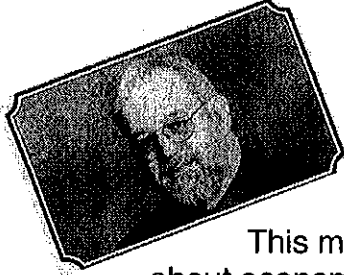

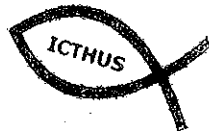
JUST A REMINDER

This month—just a short note about something I have noticed as I have been thinking about economics. Last year I read an article that made an interesting point. Do you remember Deuteronomy 5:21? It is the tenth commandment. “You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, and you shall not desire your neighbor’s house, his field or his manservant, his ox or his donkey or anything that belongs to your neighbor.” As we talk about Biblical economics I am afraid that we find ourselves in a period where each of us is being pressured from all sides to break the tenth commandment. Come on, you have heard it a million times. “Let’s stick it to the rich, tax the rich, no tax breaks for the wealthy.” They are lying to you, their facts are wrong and worst of all they are calling you to disobey God through class envy and a covetous attitude. As many people have pointed out, including Joel Belz of World magazine, the top “3 percent of all taxpayers in the United States pay more in income taxes than the other 97 percent combined.” But even more importantly the answer that is being offered is phony. “If you taxed that 3 percent of our population at a rate of 100 percent of their income, you wouldn’t produce enough additional revenue to cover the deficits our federal government is now incurring each year.” This way of thinking is leading us into coveting as a nation and it will not even solve the problem. It is a scam, a diversion from the Biblically based truth that we should not be spending more than we take in.

Our calling is to think through these things Biblically and not be molded into the world’s way of thinking dominated by class envy and coveting what others have. We are not to be filled with envy and greed, desiring what others have, or even wanting them to have less. We do not have the right, as Christians, to wish ill on others and that includes that they should have more of their possessions taken from them. Is it not strange that it the materialistic world around us teaches us to work hard, prosper, try to improve, get possessions, but if you do you are automatically the bad guy? How do you win in that situation? The wealthy are evil—except at \$10,000 a plate campaign fundraisers. “We should get rid of the loopholes for the wealthy” we hear over and over. You do realize that “loophole” is what you call a legal deduction for other people? I cannot deduct a mortgage payment – that is loophole for all you wealthy land owners. Politicians speak of “loopholes” like they appeared from outer space when they are the ones who created them. They passed the laws that made them possible and they passed the complicated laws that make honest citizens wonder each year when they turn in their tax forms if they are now criminals since no one understands the tax laws.

But here is the fun part. Our culture of envy and greed has people coveting more taxes on the wealthy. They have you so confused you are coveting what you do not even get. More taxes on the rich does not come to you it goes to the government. They have us breaking the tenth commandment for no reason. Do not fall into their trap. However you look at politics and economics—from the left or the right—build on a Biblical world view and run from the culture of coveting. Remember the tenth commandment as you watch the political silliness.

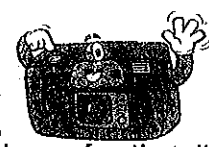

RALLY DAY BREAKFAST

FINANCE UPDATE

This update comes as we close out another summer and enter the final stretch of our church budget year. As you may know, summers are typically a time of decreased giving (mostly attributed to decreased attendance) and this summer was no exception. After missing our stewardship targets for June and July, we entered August about \$1800 below budget for the year (about 1.7% below budget). We hope to finish the year with strong stewardship, which is often the case.

For the first seven months of 2011, we exceeded our stewardship target in three months (January, April, and May) and fell short in four months (February, March, June, and July). Remember, **Electronic Offering** is available to everyone who is interested in putting their stewardship on "auto pilot." 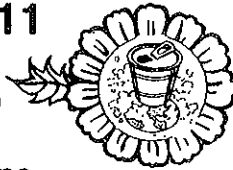

CANS FOR VBS 2011

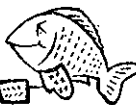
The can total for VBS 2011 was 41,858 for which \$894.15 was given to Habitat for Humanity. Thanks to everyone who saved and brought in cans.

We received \$536.00 from the Festival Parking lot. This money is designated for roof loan payment.

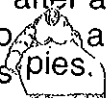


FOLK FESTIVAL UPDATES
