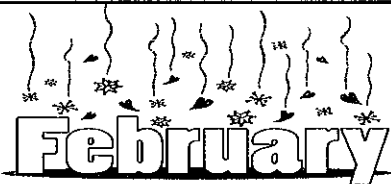

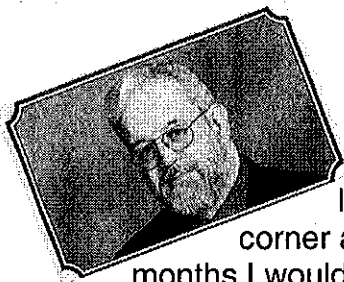

LET'S TALK ABOUT EVANGELISM

Whenever I talk about the need of our church for evangelism I get a few funny looks. People seem to have the idea that we will have to go stand on a street corner and preach, go knocking on doors, or bring in Billy Graham. In the coming few months I would like to build on the work of our Conference Evangelism team and their presentations at the Congress on Evangelism events. But this month let's start out by thinking about evangelism in general.

Luke 24 gives us a foundation for what it means to share the gospel. In verses 45-47 it gives us the **MESSAGE** of the gospel. "Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and He said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and rise again from the dead the third day; and that repentance for forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed. The message we have for the world is that Christ suffered (on the cross), that He rose again all so we could repent to find forgiveness of sins. Since this is the message we are to bring to the world we must first ask how can we share it if we have not made it part of our own lives? We ought to check that first.

The rest of verse 47 gives us the **MANDATE** for the gospel. "Repentance for forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." This echoes the great commission to go into all the world. The problem we sometimes have is that we think about sharing the gospel around the world and forget the person next door. They need this same gospel. But also notice here that this is not an option for the church. We cannot use the excuse that we need to minister to ourselves first, or that we might offend some, or that it is their problem if they don't come to church. We are commanded to take the gospel to the people. How are we doing that?

In this light notice verse 48 since it gives us the **METHOD** of evangelism: "You are witnesses of these things." God wants to use you to spread the message of Christ crucified, risen from the dead and the resulting need for our repentance. Notice it is a message and not just living it out. Certainly we are to live out the faith and be examples of Christian love but we are commanded to share the message. I have told a hundred times of two college age girls I knew who hesitated to commit their own lives to Christ because they were afraid they would have to witness to others. When they did finally come to a point of making a commitment they witnessed to others on the way back to their dorm that night. This happens because of verse 49.

In verse 49 we are given the **MEANS** by which we have the ability to share the gospel. "And behold, I am sending forth the promise of My Father upon you; but you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Jesus promised the disciples the Holy Spirit as the power behind the witness to the gospel. We have had the Spirit in the church since Pentecost and He lives in the heart of every believer. The power for you to share the gospel is not your own but it is from the Spirit. What are we afraid of? Why do we hesitate? In this ever more pagan world we must stop saying "I can't." We must rekindle the understanding that the power is not from us, but the Spirit uses us as the means to share the message, and this is not a suggestion from God but a mandate. Maybe you can't, but the Spirit through you can.




WINDOW RESTORATION UPDATE

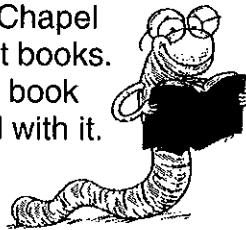

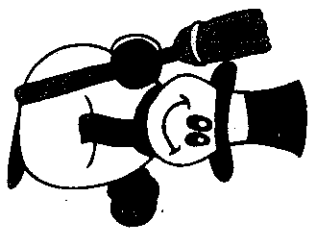

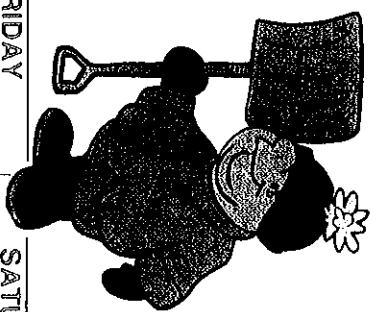
